Laffit Pincay III, Scott Hazelton to Anchor Coverage from Laurel

Laurel, MD, Oct. 9 -- Laurel Park's annual Maryland Million Day is one of the biggest days in Maryland racing, and HorseRacing TV (TM) will provide racing fans will comprehensive, live on-site coverage of the outstanding stakes-filled card on Saturday, October 14.

First post for the Maryland Million card is 12:35 p.m. ET/9:35 p.m. PT.

Laffit Pincay III and Scott Hazelton will head to Laurel Park to report on all the action of Maryland Million Day, which sports 12 stakes races and nearly \$1.5 million in purse money. A total of 167 horses have been pre-entered.

"Maryland Million Day is always one of the year's most exciting, and unique, days of racing," said Amy J. Zimmerman, executive producer for HRTV. "We're delighted to have Laffit and Scott at Laurel to bring our viewers all the action, and up-to-date information from a tremendous afternoon of top-notch racing."

The Maryland Million Day card is filled with stakes races, and it's topped by the \$250,000 Maryland Million Classic, which features 3-year-olds and up going 1 1/16 miles.

The Classic is joined by five \$150,000 events: the Million Ladies, at 1 1/16 miles on the turf; the Million Distaff, which will be contested at seven furlongs on the main track; the Million Oaks, for fillies at one mile; the Million Sprint at six furlongs; and the Million Turf at 1 1/8 miles on the grass.

The 2-year-olds clash in two seven furlong \$125,000 events. The colts battle in the Million Nursery, while their female counterparts go postward in the Million Lassie.
