



**TOP TRAINER VLADIMIR CERIN'S HONORS LATE WIFE'S MEMORY BY
CONTINUING HER EQUINE THERAPY WORK ON HORSERACING TV'S "INSIDE
INFORMATION"**

Arcadia, CA, Oct. 2 -- Southern California trainer Vladimir Cerin's tribute to his late wife by continuing her equine therapy work is the featured component of HorseRacing TV's latest edition of "Inside Information," which will air this Sunday, October 7 at 9 p.m. ET/6 p.m. PT.

In addition to Cerin's recollections, "Inside Information" will also include a look-back at former claiming horse, turned "movie star," Fighting Furrari, as well as offer a retrospective on the brilliant turf sire, Theatrical.

HRTV's Steve Kurland produced the feature on Cerin. Cerin's wife, Kellie, died suddenly this past winter when the family was vacationing in Mexico. Kellie was an accomplished horsewoman in her own right, while overseeing a large public stable of show jumpers. She was also responsible for the installation of a hyperbaric chamber at the couple's home in Bradbury, CA, an invaluable aid in expediting the recovery from equine injuries.

"Winning is the hardest part," said Cerin, who won this year's Pacific Classic with Student Council. "That's when I miss her the most."
Cerin also told Kurland that he put the home and stables -- which include the hyperbaric chamber, which is used by numerous trainers -- up for sale for two days after his wife's death, but instead chose to keep it as a living memory of Kellie.

Terrence Theetge produced a piece on Fighting Furrari, the primary horse used in the movie Seabiscuit, who now resides at Santa Anita Park. Known around the barn as "Fred," he's becoming an accomplished show jumper in the off-season, winning a blue ribbon in a jumping class this summer at a San Juan Capistrano show.

Daisy Phipps produced, and Matthew Wolff edited, a piece updating the current career of 1987 Champion Turf horse Theatrical. Now 25 years old, Theatrical is the sire of Breeders' Cup Mile favorite Shakespeare.
